- 1ST TIME GUESTS: Most everything you need is found in this bulletin. Plus, those around you are glad to help and an usher is always available at the main rear entrance. If there are ways we can better extend God's hospitality, leave us a note on the Welcome Card. Your insights are essential as we continue to grow into the community God is calling us to be. Thank you!
- **HOW TO PARTICIPATE:** Congregational readings are in bold with an *All*, *People*, or *Unison* designation. Songs are in the bulletin or pew hymnal. Times for standing and sitting are listed, with it always being okay to remain seated.
- "BUSY BAGS': Coloring books and crayons are available in the north narthex (lobby) for use during worship. Please return all items following the service for others to use the following week. See an usher for assistance.
- **NURSERY SPACE:** During the summer, the space is available for use with parental/guardian supervision. No attendant is present. Live audio of the worship service is broadcast to the nursery. The nursery is past the office, to the right. See an usher for assistance.
- **SUNDAY SCHOOL:** Will return Sept. 21st. Classes will be held during worship for 1st 7th graders, each Sunday (except the first Sunday of the month).
- **RESTROOMS:** Ladies and a unisex/accessible bathroom (with wall mounted baby changing table) are available through the doors at the front of the sanctuary. Follow the signs to the office. Bathrooms are on the left.
- **LARGE PRINT BULLETINS:** Contain printed scripture and music, in addition to being in a larger font. Ask an usher for a copy.
- **HEARING ASSISTANCE:** Ask an usher at the rear entrance to the sanctuary who will provide you with a device directly tied into the sanctuary sound system. Please return the device to an usher at the conclusion of worship.
- **GET CONNECTED:** Use the pew holder Welcome Card to register your attendance, share contact information, ask questions, and more. Once completed, place it in the offering plates during the offering time.
- WIFI & DEVICES: Thank you for silencing all your devices during worship. Bausman's guest wifi is accessible with the passcode: "gladurhere!"

Gospel Lesson: Luke 10:25-37

An expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

But wanting to vindicate himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and took off, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while traveling came

upon him, and when he saw him he was moved with compassion. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, treating them with oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him, and when I come back I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Not too Late to View Some of the General Synod Plenaries and Worships Being Livestreamed Including TODAY!

As many are currently gathered for General Synod in Kansas City, the United Church of Christ National Setting has special options for people to tune into parts of Synod's work and worship from near and far.

A livestream, is being hosted on a special page of the UCC website (https://www.ucc.org/gs-livestream/). Being broadcasted are plenary sessions and worship gatherings of General Synod, taking place now!

The two remaining General Synod worship services will be livestreamed for people to worship together from near and far.

"While much of our focus in planning General Synod goes toward creating the best possible in-person gathering, we also want to invite those unable to come to Kansas City to be attuned to the work of this broader body and joined together in worship," said General Synod Administrator and UCC Chief of Staff, Rev. Joshua Baird.

Many elements of General Synod will not be livestreamed, including keynote speaker Jennifer Butler, workshops, special events, and fellowship times.

The additional steps taken to record plenary sessions and make them broadly available ensure access and transparency for the collective work of the delegate body, Baird noted.

General Synod has two remaining worship services, including a community worship service TODAY, July 13 at 3:00, featuring General Minister and President Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson as preacher. Rev. Tony Coleman is the featured preacher for closing worship on July 15.
