- 1ST TIME GUESTS: Most everything you need is found in this bulletin. Plus, those around you are glad to help and an usher is always available at the main rear entrance. 

Message for the Young & Young at Heart

Prayer of Illumination

All: Eternal God, in the reading of the scripture, may your Word be heard; in the meditations of our hearts, may your Word be known; and in the faithfulness of our lives, may your Word be shown. Amen.

Epistle Lesson: Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16 (p. #225)

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance, and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith, with Sarah's involvement, he received power of procreation, even though he was too old, because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better homeland, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

Gospel Lesson: Luke 12:32-40 (p. #75) – Reader

"Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

"Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks. Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them. If he comes during the middle of the night or near dawn and finds them so, blessed are those slaves.

"But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."

A Message from our Associate Conference Minister for Search & Call

I'm currently serving on three different teams working on creating new guidelines or systems for the new Keystone Conference. One of the challenges each of these teams face is taking under consideration different ways of being a conference found in different parts of the state and then creating something that will hopefully meet the needs of all our churches across the state. That means there are more people in the room with different experiences and expectations of what a conference does and does not do.

More people in the room requires more listening, more relationships to attend to, and more experiences that need to be honored and considered. For some, that is challenge and God knows it's certainly a challenge for our country right now. More people are excising other people from their lives or letting less people into their lives, simply because they don't want to listen to anyone other than those they agree with.

I'm not saying that there aren't times when we need to decide to step back from a toxic relationship or from hearing toxic words, but my general instinct is that God wants us to widen the circle to include more of God's children, as challenging as that might for some of us.

That may be one of the great gifts from this merger – or at least I hope it is.

From the Addiction & Recovery Taskforce: Substance Abuse and the Big Beautiful Bill

The "One Big Beautiful Bill" is projected to negatively impact access to Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment, potentially increasing the number of overdoses and deaths.

The bill's Medicaid cuts will cause 7.8 million people to lose their insurance. These cuts would potentially cause 1.6 million people to lose access to SUD treatment, according to the Center for American Progress.

A separate analysis from Penn LDI, projects that this bill could double the rate of overdoses, resulting in approximately 1,000 additional deaths each year.

It also introduces work requirements that could make it more difficult for individuals to access necessary healthcare and treatment.

This bill is expected to have a detrimental effect on the nation's already existing mental health crisis, with potential negative consequences for those with substance use disorders.

The impact that this is expected to have on our churches in the coming months is imminent.

The Lay Leadership Support Group, open to all church leaders is a group that gathers once a month on the fourth Saturday via Zoom. The group will not be meeting in August.


