"Still the Same, But Completely Different"

"Jesus said to them 'come and have breakfast.'...He came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead." – John 21:12-14

I love John's telling of the resurrection, because it speaks so well to the human condition. After all the hype and the hoopla, after all the fears and the breathing upon them of the Holy Spirit, after Thomas' great moment of doubt, it seems like life has gone back to normal. Except it hasn't.

Without Jesus around to lead and direct their every move, the disciples go back to what they know. They go back to fishing. Just like they always had done. Except, they now live in a world in which Jesus has been raised from the dead. And not just that, they live in a world in which they have been called and claimed to God's ministry. It makes a difference that they cannot escape, even as they look to go back to what they had always known.

In the third and final appearance of Jesus to the disciples, he calls them from their boats and nets and fish to eat breakfast with him. The imagery of the dawning of a new day foreshadows the reality awaiting them in that meal. The disciples went into the night on their own and came up empty. But in the morning, as they responded to Jesus' words spoken to them, their nets became full. And now they sit with him by the fire-side, filling themselves with what he has provided. A filling that culminates in the words "follow me."

From an outsider's perspective, everything would have seemed the same, but to those who shared in that morning's meal, it was clear that everything had become different. The reality of years of discipleship crystallized in that moment, as well as the ministry birthed through the cross and Christ's resurrection. Though the world looked exactly the same, they could not escape the fact that they were now completely different.

We also stand at the dawn of a new beginning where Christ is inviting us to come, and sit, and eat, and listen, that we too might follow. Like the disciples before us the temptation is to go back to what we have always known, what we have always done, once the whoopla has ended. Easily, you could say nothing has changed. While at the same time everything is now completely different. After years of transition, uncertainty, and challenge, a new day has dawned.

Let us be bold in listening and responding to the Resurrected One who has brought us to this moment and now calls us forth to follow in his calling.

FUTURE SUNDAY SERVICES AND EVENTS

Prospective New Member's Class - Orientation Gathering, April 7th

April 14th - Bible Presentation

Youth, second to third grade, will receive a "Deep Blue Kids Bible" (Common English Bible translation) which is perfect for their learning and growth in Sunday School and at home.

April 21st Townhall & May 5th Congregational Meeting

Since January, the Finance Team, Committees, and Consistory, have been working to faithfully develop a full 2024 budget that includes financial projections into 2025. The goal has been to create a realistic, faith filled budget, that moves the congregation towards financial sustainability while investing in the staff and ministries central to Bausman's vitality.

On April 21st, you are invited to stay following worship for a townhall meeting to review, discuss, and comment on the budget proposal. Feedback will be incorporated into a final form of the budget proposal that will be voted upon on May 5th, at a congregational meeting held immediately after worship.

Becoming An Apron Church – Tip #1

When you are parking on Sunday for worship, are you parking with guests and other members in mind? If you are physically able to walk with relative ease, are you parking at a distance to reserve the best spots for members with mobility challenges and guests who statistically arrive in the 5 minutes before or after worship services begin?

Yes, it is an inconvenience to park at a distance and walk. This is especially true when there is rain or snow cover. My kids regularly ask me why I have to park so far away (which honestly isn't that far. I park at the bottom of Belmont most Sundays. And on Christmas Eve I parked on Fairview with the expectation of more members, friends, and guests to make space for.) "You're the pastor. You should have your own spot," they tell me. My response is that us walking is part of our hospitality and sharing Christ's love and care for others.

Being an apron church invites us to think of our parking decisions as ministry. Plus, here are some things to know:

You can drop off your passengers in the semi-circle drive before parking (and you can even pick them up again after the worship service if desiring).

The dentist across from the semi-circle drive graciously lets us use his parking lot Sunday mornings.

These are great spots for members since there is no easy way to communicate the availability of these spots to guests

You can park on Penn Avenue on Sunday for more than an hour. Just pay attention to the signs that tell you how far to park from the intersection to ensure people can clearly see traffic when pulling out onto Penn Ave.

Redner's Receipts: Help Earn Free Money for Bausman

Did you know Bausman collects Redner's receipts, big and small, to raise money that supports our ministry? Last year, \$558 was raised through Redner's receipts that would otherwise be thrown in the trash. What is great about this program is we can receive the receipts from anyone who shops at Redner's. They don't have to be a member. They don't need to scan a special card. All they need is to hand you their complete Redner's receipt and you to drop it off at the church (either in the church office or the box in the East Narthex). Let's aim for \$700 in free Redner's receipt money this year!

Thank you to Lois Talarigo and Helen Fisher who faithfully prepare our receipts for submission to Redner's. And thank you to each of you who provides receipts in support of God's ministry.

Reviving the Giant Grocery Card Team – Free Money – 30 minutes of service

By giving 30-45 minutes of time after worship once a month, you could help Bausman raise thousands of dollars to invest in ministry. How? By helping members, friends, and guests conveniently and easily purchase Giant Grocery store gift cards (and possibly other stores in the future). The cards are sold at face value, so the purchaser doesn't lose a cent of what they pay for the cards. And the church receives 5% of the sale. With a household of 4 easily spending \$1,000 a month on groceries, that could translate into \$600 of money raised for the church's ministry each year per family.



Phone System Failure – Only Office Phone Active

On Monday March 11th, it was discovered that none of the church's phones were functioning. With onsite support from Comcast, we quickly learned the issue was with our phone equipment. Specifically, our phone switch that routes signals throughout the building had failed. This is an issue we have been watching and holding off on addressing due to other pressing needs and the cost associated with the repair/replacement. At this point we have been able to connect the office phone with a patch that bypasses the failed switch. However, all other phones remain inoperable. At this point we are exploring options and vendors to determine pricing and possibilities on how to best return full phone service to the facility. This process is expected to take several weeks as a minimum.

Many of our congregation might remember our daughter Alison, who was in 10th grade when we joined Bausman UCC. She was an active member of the church Youth Group while she was in high school. Now a mother of three, a Navy wife, and a Navy Reservist herself, she recently had the good fortune of seeing the Taylor Swift Era's Tour in Tokyo, Japan, where she and her family are currently stationed. Her Facebook post after the concert was so poignant that we wanted to share it with our Bausman Family and those of us who were here when Taylor Swift was just a young girl:



Ali's Post:

"It was the end of a decade but the start of an age." When I was a senior in high school, I mentored our middle school confirmation class at church. There was a shy, musically talented girl in our group with long curly hair who was incredibly pensive and thoughtful. Her name was Taylor Swift. She wasn't around too much because she was constantly traveling between Pennsylvania and Nashville, trying to launch her career. But when she was there, she was your typical middle school girl. Awkward, shy and desperate to be liked by everyone. On Christmas Eve, she performed a song she had written that day that I heard on an album years later. Looking back, it was incredible to see her raw art in such an intimate setting. Like many, my entire adulthood is marked by her music. Seeing her perform live for the first time since that Christmas Eve almost 20 years ago, and as one of the most powerful female icons in the world, was an incredibly moving experience. As I head into my 40s later this year, I cannot fathom a better way to remind

me of all the life experiences and soundtracks that have led me to this point and the excitement I have for the chapter that's ahead. As I watched her perform nonstop for 3.5 hours, I laughed, cried, and smiled as all the memories that her music evokes flooded back to me. It's been an insane few weeks in our house, but I'm grateful for the friends who offered positive peer pressure to ensure I didn't miss this historic event, for my husband who didn't freak out when I told him how much I spent on a ticket 2 days before the event, and for Taylor and her incredible music. #longlive \$\mathcal{I}\$

Commentary

Our expenses for the 1st 2 months are 3.7% under the year to date budget. Unfortunately our revenue was below expenses for February by \$5,000.

Several line items in expenses were over budget; particularly the snow removal expense of \$4,550 which exceeded the total 2024 budget of \$3,000. We can hope that as of this point in time we will be done with this expense for the balance of 2024, although no one knows what next December will yield. Our HVAC repairs were also high for the first 2 months due to repairs to the blowers – total expense \$2,913. Overall our expenses for the first 2 months are running under budget by \$2,011 while our revenue is \$4,300 under budget.
