HOW TO PARTICIPATE: Congregational readings are in bold with an *All*, *People*, or *Unison* designation. Songs are in the bulletin or pew hymnal. Times for standing and sitting are listed, with it always being okay to remain seated.

“BUSY BAGS”: Coloring books and crayons are available in the north narthex (lobby) for use during worship. Please return all items following the service for others to use the following week. See an usher for assistance.

NURSERY CARE: Available during worship for children birth-kindergarten. The nursery is past the office, to the right. See an usher for assistance.

SUNDAY SCHOOL: Is held during worship for 1st – 7th graders, except the first Sunday of the month. Youth meet their teachers after the children's message in the sanctuary. Parents, please pick up your child from the 2nd floor classrooms immediately following worship. Follow signs for the office.

RESTROOMS: Ladies and a unisex/accessible bathroom (with wall mounted baby changing table) are available through the doors at the front of the sanctuary. Follow the signs to the office. Bathrooms are on the left.

LARGE PRINT BULLETINS: Contain printed scripture and music, in addition to being in a larger font. Ask an usher for a copy.

Epistle Lesson: 1 Corinthians 2:1-13 (p. #166)

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the testimony of God to you with superior speech or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were made not with persuasive words of wisdom but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are being destroyed. But we speak God's wisdom, a hidden mystery, which God decreed before the ages for our glory and which none of the rulers of this age understood, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written,

“What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him”—

God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For what human knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. And we speak of these things in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual things to those who are spiritual.

Gospel Lesson: Matthew 5:13-20 (p. #4)

“You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything but is thrown out and trampled under foot.

“You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. People do not light a lamp and put it under the bushel basket; rather, they put it on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

“Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

Bring Last Year's Palm Branches to Worship February 15 - Did you save your palm branches from last Palm Sunday? If so, bring them to worship on February 15. They will be included in the children's message and then burned following worship to make Ash Wednesday's ashes. The burning of the palms reminds us that our ultimate hope is the victory of Jesus on the cross, who raises us with him from death to life. All are invited to participate in the brief outdoor burning service following the morning worship.

Ash Wednesday Worship – February 18, 6:30pm - Ash Wednesday is an opportunity to intentionally step into the spiritual journey of Lent through the receiving of ashes and a special altar communion. This information has been known to be dropped from the hospital's system. Regardless, giving the church a call (or having a family member know to do so) will help ensure you receive intentional care from your congregation.

Would You Like to Be Receiving Home Communion? - Has your life situation changed in the last 6-18 months? Have you discovered it has been a long time since you have been able to physically attend worship? If so, we would love to include you in home communion visits. Communion is a central part of our relationship with Christ and with God's church. With the expanded lay minister care team we are providing quarterly home communion. A Message to the Conference

February 03, 2026

Lift every voice and sing 'till earth and heaven ring

Ring with the harmony of liberty

Let our rejoicing rise high as the list'ning skies

Let it resound loud as the rolling sea.

Sing a song full of the faith that the dark past has taught us

Sing a song full of the hope that the present has brought us

Facing the rising sun of our new day begun

Let us march on 'till victory is won.

-Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing James Weldon Johnson

On February 12, 1900, a choir of 500 children at a segregated school first performed *Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing* for the first time publicly, song in Jacksonville, Florida, to celebrate President Abraham Lincoln's birthday. Brothers, James Weldon Johnson and John Rosedmond Johnson wrote and composed this song which became known as the Black National Anthem. This powerful anthem is deeply rooted in our American story and is included in most hymnals acknowledging the ongoing struggle for justice and liberation.

In February, we often return to this song that has carried generations through struggle and hope rooted in the deep conviction that God walks with those who seek freedom. When we sing it today, we step into a story larger than ourselves. The song remembers the "dark past," the "bitter chastening rod," and the long road toward dignity and equality. It refuses to gloss over suffering. It refuses to domesticate the story. And yet, it rises with a hope that is both courageous and costly.

More than a century after its writing, the song still speaks to where we are as a nation. We continue to witness racial injustice, inequity, and violence that contradict the very ideals we claim to cherish. We continue to see communities grieving losses that should never have happened. We continue to long for a world where every voice can sing in safety and freedom.

And still, the song calls us forward. It calls us to lift every voice, not just the comfortable ones, not just the loud ones, not just the privileged ones, but the voices long silenced or ignored. It calls us to remember that justice is not a passive hope but a shared responsibility. It calls us to stay "true to our God" and "true to our native land" which is not defined by borders, walls, or masked ICE officers but by God's will being done. This month, may we hear the song not as vapid wistfulness, but as invitation.

An invitation to remember.

An invitation to reckon.

An invitation to act.

And an invitation for every voice to keep singing until freedom is real for all.
