A Message to the Conference

January 27, 2026

Dear Keystone Members and Friends –

“When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying: ‘Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.’” – Matthew 5:1-3 NRSV

The photo shown here of me and my wife Marsha was taken in May, 2023, on what is called “The Mount of Beatitudes” overlooking the Sea of Galilee. As you can see, it is a beautiful, serene place. You can easily imagine Jesus speaking words of blessing to his disciples in such lovely, tranquil setting.

But of course, the reality of first century Palestine was that life was anything but tranquil. And by the end of October in 2023, whatever semblance of calm that may have appeared to be there was undoubtedly shaken. The lives of people then and now, both in the Holy Land and in all lands, have never been completely placid. From violence to economic uncertainty to hunger to storms (even snowstorms!), we find ourselves facing trouble. And yet, in the midst of our turmoil – the kind of turmoil that Jesus is intimately acquainted with – Jesus says, “Blessed are you...”

We are at the dawn of a new day with the Keystone Conference. We have become one, and there are moments when the transition seems to be going according to plan. But more often than not, there are bumps in the road. In those moments, we may be tempted to say, “Why can’t we just go back to the way things were?” But in the midst of that anxiety, Jesus speaks with a voice that calms the Sea of Galilee, saying, “Blessed are you.”

Despite the turmoil of our present time, I am more convinced than ever that God’s hand has been in this process and continues to be. I believe God calls us to be a church that doesn’t seek external lack of conflict in all things but that does seek a peace that knows the presence of God in the midst of whatever difficulty we are facing. That is a message in which we, as the Keystone Conference, can trust and believe. In the midst of all of life’s storms, Jesus says to us, “Blessed are you...” Listen for that voice today. Jesus is saying it to you.
