"Come to the Party"

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near... in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." ~Philippians 4:4-7

On Sunday, May 19th, at 3:30pm, Bausman will host a Celebration of Installation worship service.

Knowing that there is already a worship service in the morning, why would you come? Why would you bother to check in online? Depending on your faith tradition and background, you possibly have never been a part of an installation service before. The last one held for a lead pastor at Bausman was when Rev. Doug Shaffer was installed as Bausman's pastor. And that was back in 1991!

So, what's the big deal with installation services?

First, there is the theological part of a congregation and pastor covenanting together to faithfully serve God by committing themselves to one another, in service to their community and to this flesh and blood expression of the body of Christ, for the sake of God's love being poured out upon creation. Installation services need both the congregation and the pastor in order to spiritually enter into this covenant.

Second, this will be one of the few instances where the wider church will show up in mass to be part of the worshiping community of Bausman. If you have children, this is powerful for them to see so many other pastors in their church at the same time. It is a teaching moment of sharing how Bausman doesn't exist as at church on its own. This congregation is prayed for and supported in so many ways by churches across Berks County, and across the country. Because of this we are planning for a children's message, so that our children will be blessed through this service.

Third, it is a party! A special choir anthem has been selected for this day and the rest of the music is rich in joy and meaning. The Conference Minister of the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference will be present to share greetings, the co-chair of the Covenant Association Committee on Ministry will lead the liturgy of installation, and clergy from across the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference will lead other aspects of the service. The culmination of the service is the communion shared between pastor and congregation, given freely and abundantly to all others who have gathered – a reflection of the relationship entered into that day.

Plus, there's food afterwards. Wonderful desserts from what I have been told!

Let us join together in a spirit of celebration, inviting God to bless and make fruitful the relationship we now seek to enter into.

Becoming An Apron Church - Tip #2: Embodying Jesus' Welcome

Last month's tip shared how parking can be an act of ministry. Guests tend to arrive 5 minutes before or after the start of the worship service. As a member, you can provide an incredible welcome by choosing not to park on Trent Ave so that these spaces are available for guests and those with mobility challenges.

Beyond parking, the next point of welcome is at the church door. A question to ask is, does a person need to enter the church before they are welcomed or is the membership creating the first point of personal welcome outside the church doors? The answer matters. When you think about Jesus' ministry, he was continually going to incredible lengths to ensure people knew they were welcomed and loved. By welcoming other members and guests outside the church doors, we embody and witness to Jesus' extravagant welcome and love. Plus, on a practical level, it does wonders to lower the anxiety and uncertainty of guests. By greeting on the outside of the church doors, it lets people know they are at the right place, at the right time, that they are valued, and that people are there to guide them in this new church experience.

A huge word of thanks is due to Lori Moser! Following Nancy's resignation last year to retire to her childhood home in the Caribbean, Lori has stepped in to the secretary role with dedication, wisdom, creativity, flexibility, and grace. She has given and done so much as we have sought to overhaul the secretary job description and begin the transition towards an Administrative and Communications Coordinator. The church would not be where it is without her support.

Once we have hired and trained a person for the new Administrative and Communications Coordinator role, Lori is looking forward to resuming her previous position as one of the church sextons. Make sure to share your words of appreciation with Lori.

Security and Access Enhancements

This week we have implemented several security and access enhancements. They include reopening the East Narthex entrance before worship services, changing the nursery lock to give access to the room throughout the week while allowing it to be locked while in use, rekeying all exterior doors, and removing previously "hidden" keys. If you need access to the church outside of worship service times, please contact the church office for a keypad access code.

Phone System Replacement - Coming this May

After reviewing options, the Property Committee, with the support of Consistory, is moving forward with a plan to replace the church's current phone system with an internet based (VOIP) system. This decision is based upon cost, flexibility, system capabilities, and the trend in small business phone systems. In short, replacement parts do not exist for our current system. Therefore, the entire system needs to be replaced in order to have functional phones. The VOIP option is thousands of dollars less expensive than a "traditional" system and has more capabilities. Plus, "traditional systems" are no longer being manufactured for organizations and businesses our size.

Recognizing the prolific growth of mobile phones, the number of phones needed throughout the church was also evaluated. The result is a plan to install four phones at this time, knowing that additional phones can be added at any time. The phones will be located in the main office, pastor's office, in a new location in the kitchen hallway (by the door intercom), and in the 2^{nd} floor hallway.

Redner's Receipts: Help Earn Free Money for Bausman

Did you know Bausman collects Redner's receipts, big and small, to raise money that supports our ministry? What is great about this program is we can receive the receipts from anyone who shops at Redner's. They don't have to be a member. They don't need to scan a special card. All they need is to hand you their complete Redner's receipt and you to drop it off at the church (either in the church office or the box in the East Narthex). Last year, \$558 was raised through Redner's receipts. This year, will you help us reach \$700 in free Redner's receipt money?

Giant Grocery Card (Year Round Fundraiser)

If you or family members shop at Giant, you can support the church by using a Giant Gift Card purchased at the church. It doesn't cost you anything more, but the church receives 5% of your gift card purchase. If you spend \$1,000 on groceries a month, you could be contributing an additional \$600 annually to the church through Giant Gift Card purchases. Stop by the office to purchase your gift cards.

East Narthex Entrance Now Open Before Worship

As more people gather for worship and more parking is occurring along Belmont Ave, we have reopened the East Narthex entrance on Sunday mornings. This entrance will be locked at the start of the worship service for security purposes. We pray this re-opening is a blessing that supports your acts of hospitality of opening up Trent Ave parking for guests and members with mobility challenges.

Digital Sign Update

When the digital sign was installed, plans were quickly made with the company to add the missing halo lighting around the cross and to correct the color to match what had been publicized to the congregation. With the return of warmer weather, we anticipate this work being completed sometime in May or June at the latest. Thank you for your support and patience in this project that has led to a number of people checking out Bausman for the first time!

May Safety Tip!

An **Automated External Defibrillator (AED)** is a portable defibrillator that you can use if someone goes into sudden cardiac arrest (SCA). An ambulance may take 10 minutes or more to arrive at the scene, but cardiac arrest patients require treatment without delay. With each minute that passes, their chances of survival decline by 10%. An AED is designed so that anyone can provide life-saving treatment in an emergency; it provides audible defibrillation and CPR coaching to guide untrained bystanders.

Commentary

Thanks to the congregation's giving in March the unrestricted revenue exceeded expenses.

Expenses for the first 3 months are 5.2% under the year to date budget. While revenue for the same period was below budget by 8.0%, the original budget called for a 9% deficit.

As of the end of March our Year-to-Date property expenses are running 31.7% or \$4,263 over budget mainly due to the gas utility, as well as the snow removal and HVAC expenses that were outlined in February's report. Meanwhile all of our expenses are continuing to stay below budget by a total of \$4,034 as shown above.

The checking account balance at the end of March was \$47,150.00 of which \$32,763.00 was available to pay operating expenses for April.
