## All Saints

*"For we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints." – Colossians 1:2*

The word saint appears 63 times in the Bible. 62 of those times are found in the New Testament. And of those, nearly all of them are in the letters to the early church. As originally used in the Bible, the term refers to the living faithful who hold belief in Jesus Christ. But by 100 A.D., with persecution and martyrdom rampantly growing, the term began to be used for those who had died for their faith, as a way of honoring them for their sacrifice and steadfast obedience to Christ.

In 609 A.D., Pope Boniface IV established the first church wide All Saints Feast Day to be held on May 13<sup>th</sup>. By the 9<sup>th</sup> century, Pope Gregory IV declared November 1<sup>st</sup> the day for which the church was to celebrate the deceased saints of the church. Then, by the year 1000 A.D. a formal canonization process was developed to officially identify specific, deceased individuals as "saints" of the church.

The Protestant churches of the Reformation continued the tradition of celebrating All Saints, but they reinterpreted it as a celebration of all believers, not just those canonized by the Catholic Church. The shift was a result of their reading of the scriptures and their recognition that the New Testament didn't relegate the term "saint" to a few

believers, but to the entirety of Christian believers. The celebration of All Saints is among the oldest of Christian traditions. Through this worship we not only open ourselves to connection with those who have gone before us in the faith; we also open ourselves to their faithfulness and hope. We are reminded that we stand amongst such a great cloud of witnesses who have endured hardship and shame, ministered with faithfulness and love, and who, in their time, lit a candle of light in the darkness that we now hold in our hand.

Let us worship and give thanks for all the saints, past and present, whose faith stands as a light before us, leading us all the more in the way of Christ.





## Mission of the Month

Spartan Station is a food, hygiene and personal care repository operated by the Wyomissing Area School District. The SOAR Committee has recently added Spartan Station to the missions we support once we learned that approximately 20% of the students surveyed were concerned about running out of food one or more times in the past year.

We also learned that approximately 40% of the students K - 12 receive free lunch - meaning at least 40% of the students reside in households with income at or below 130% of the poverty level. An average of 8% of the students surveyed reported skipping a meal because of family finances one or more times in the past year.

The weekender bag program has almost doubled in the last three school years- going from 73 students in 2023 to 130+ in 2025. The weekender bag program is for students in grades K - 6 only. Secondary students require more substantial food options and are less willing to accept bags because many would rather not get food than suffer the embarrassment of accepting it.

The school district must work with a program sponsor that is a 501(c)(3) because the district is under the 50% free lunch eligibility. Monthly food



deliveries from Helping Harvest will cost approximately \$1300 per year and the food can only be used for students who are in the free lunch program or are willing to give family financial statements to prove eligibility.

The items Bausman provides may be given to students who don't have to provide financial proof to obtain the necessities they need to survive. Please help if you are able, because it is proven that students perform better when they have enough food to eat.

### Harvest Home - November 16

Food collection for Calvary UCC's food pantry, New Journey Mission and Spartan Station will continue until November 16 when the food will be blessed and delivered later that week.

### Knit Hat Mission - November 23

## Harvest Home Food Collection

A new mission, Spartan Station has been added to this year's Harvest Home Food Collection starting October 19 through November 16. Spartan Station is a food, hygiene and personal care repository operated by the Wyomissing Area School District for approximately 40% of WASD K-12 students who reside in households with incomes at, or below, 130% of the poverty level.

This year, food collected in bags with a white shopping list will go to Calvary UCC Food Pantry and New Journey Community Outreach and food and personal care items collected in bags with a blue shopping list will go to Spartan Station. Thank you for helping feed your neighbors who are too proud to say that they have not eaten today.

## Knit Hat Ministry

The Knit Hat ministry is coming close to the Holiday season when the hats will be blessed and distributed to our community . Anyone who is making hats, labeling hats or placing the heart on the hats, kindly bring your hats to the library by Nov 9, 2025.

## Constitution & Bylaws Update

The initial draft of Bausman's Constitution has been developed and forwarded to Consistory for review. In addition, the church's articles of incorporation are being reviewed to ensure they are up-to-date and there is no conflict between them and the draft Constitution. With Consistory affirmation, work will begin on the Bylaws with a first draft being reviewed by the end of January. The current plan is to have the draft Constitution and Bylaws available to the congregation for review and feedback by March. The Constitution & Bylaws team members are Mike Ritter (chair), Marcelino Colon, Sue Showalter, Sue Wentink, Nevin Hollinger, and Pastor Joe.

## New Headphones for Hearing Assistance Devices

As part of this year's sound system upgrade, the headphones for our sanctuary hearing assistance devices have been replaced. The devices connect directly to the sound system so that listeners receive a direct feed of the worship service. Plus, each device comes with a personal volume control allowing users to personalize their volume needs. The new headphones have adjustable headbands and soft, non-porous ear pads, which allows for a comfortable fit and easy sanitation after each use. The hearing assistance devices are available by the Penn Avenue sanctuary entrance.

## Pennsylvania Southeast Conference (PSEC) Final Meeting

Cece Wagner, Mike Ritter, and Pastor Joe will serve as delegates to the final meeting of the PSEC on November 8 at St. Paul's UCC, Amityville. This meeting will focus on the achievements and sorrows known in the 68-year life of this Conference. Beginning January 1, 2026, the PSEC will cease to exist as it fully merges into the Keystone Conference, which includes all of Pennsylvania and a few congregations in New Jersey and Maryland.

## Managed IT Services Onboarding In Process

At its September meeting, Consistory entered into an agreement with Eberly Systems to begin providing Managed IT services for Bausman. In a nutshell, managed IT services will provide increased digital security, professional support for our digital technology implementation, and access to a help desk when IT issues are encountered. We are currently engaged in the "onboarding" process which will take about a month to complete. All of this work will occur in the background with no visible impact on the congregation or its communication systems. By the end of November, our office staff will begin to receive training on the new technology structure and security systems.

# Announcements

## Sound System Enhancements Coming Soon

The new sound system has been a great success! It has performed to expectations with little need for changes. With funds still remaining from the original installation, the Worship & Music Committee has authorized work to be completed for the following minor enhancements.

- Replace the chancel floor microphones used for welcome and announcements and special music with microphones that pick up sound from a broader range. The current floor microphones are from the previous sound system and have shown themselves not well designed for their current use.
- Disconnect old chancel microphone floor jacks and install two new chancel platform jacks. The original floor jacks have proven to have inconsistent ground fault issues. Due to their location and the discontinuation of that type of jack, they will be abandoned in place and new jacks installed in an easier to access location.
- Install a piano microphone. This will primarily benefit the sound quality for the livestream, but will also allow enhancement within the sanctuary as well.
- Install an easily accessible power switch for the sound system.

## Property Committee

The church recently changed our HVAC vendor and is now using Advanced Comfort Specialists. Advanced Comfort Specialists performed a full cleaning and evaluation of the boiler and heating system. Their final analysis is that the boiler is too small for the size of the church. They believe that this has led to the issues we have been experiencing. They recommended adding sections to the boiler to increase the capacity. The cost of this expansion puts the project out of range for this year; however, the Property Committee is evaluating the cost benefit of pursuing the project.

## 2026 Endowment Disbursement

During the October meeting of the Faith Legacy Committee, we unanimously approved a 5% distribution of the 3-year rolling average for all four of the Bausman endowments.

These funds will be available for use in calendar year 2026. We praise God for this good news!

And again, thank you for the offerings from all Bausman members which enabled us to pay an unexpected \$10,700 bill for boiler/furnace repairs from the general operating checking account.
